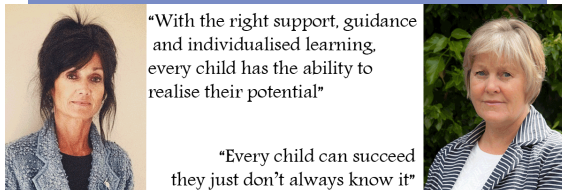


Specialists in educating challenging students
